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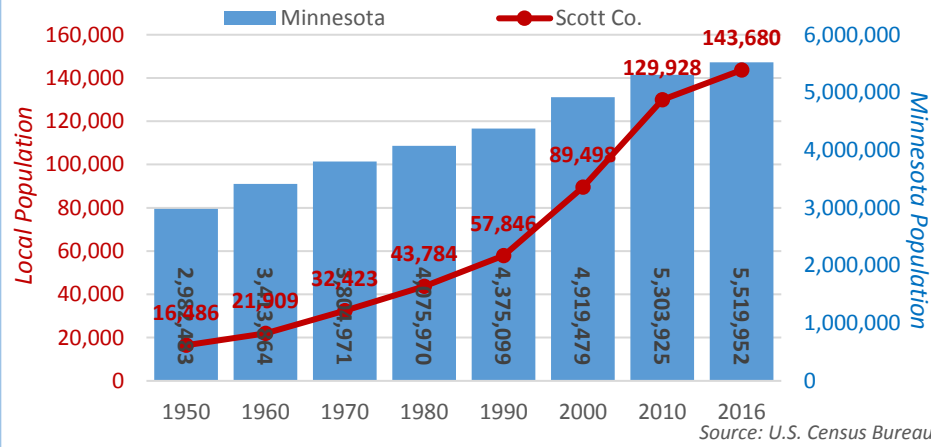

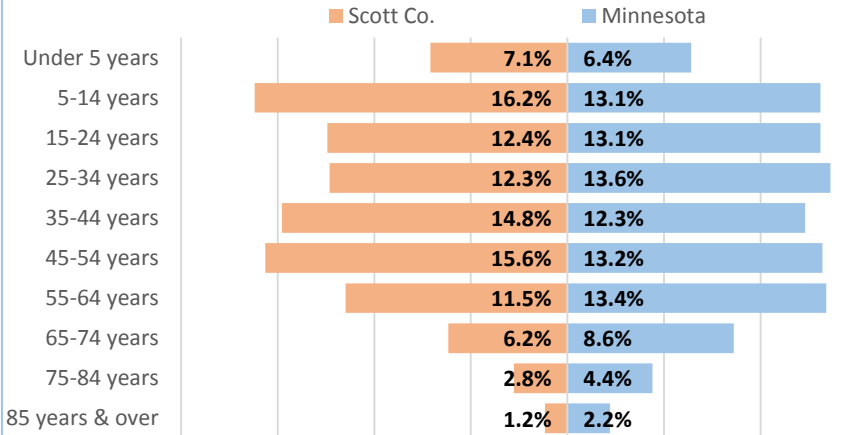
Figure 1. Population Change, 1950-2016

Figure 3. Population Pyramid, 2000-2016

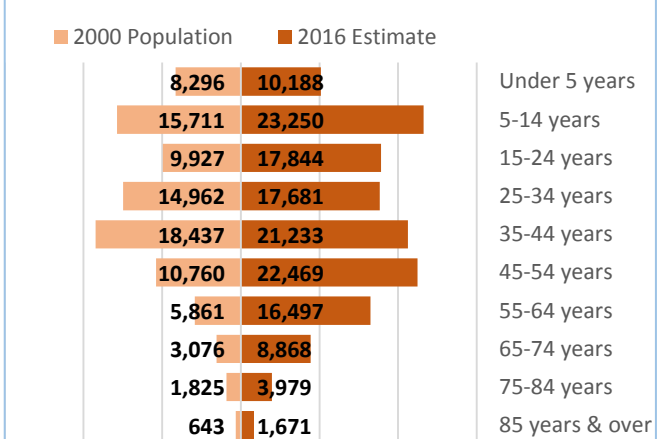


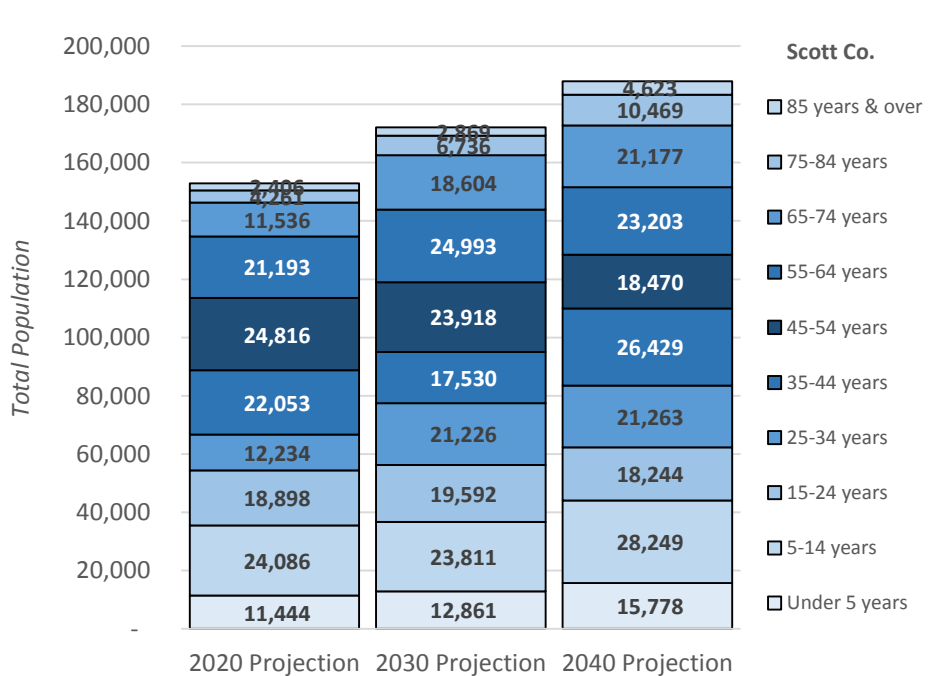

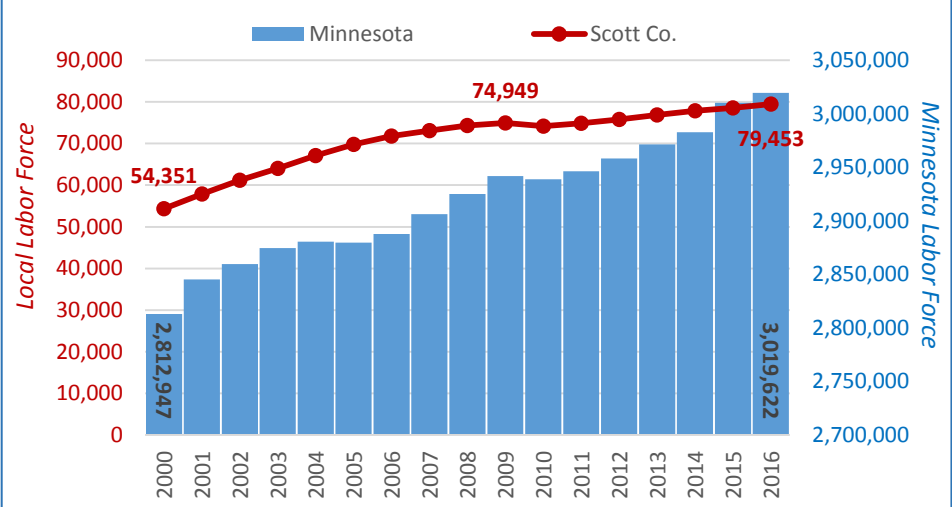

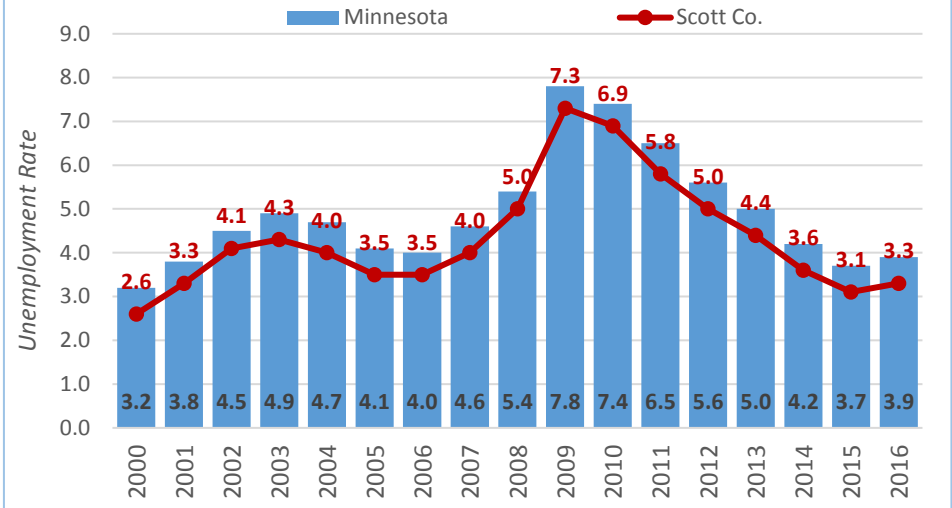

Figure 5. Annual Labor Force Estimates



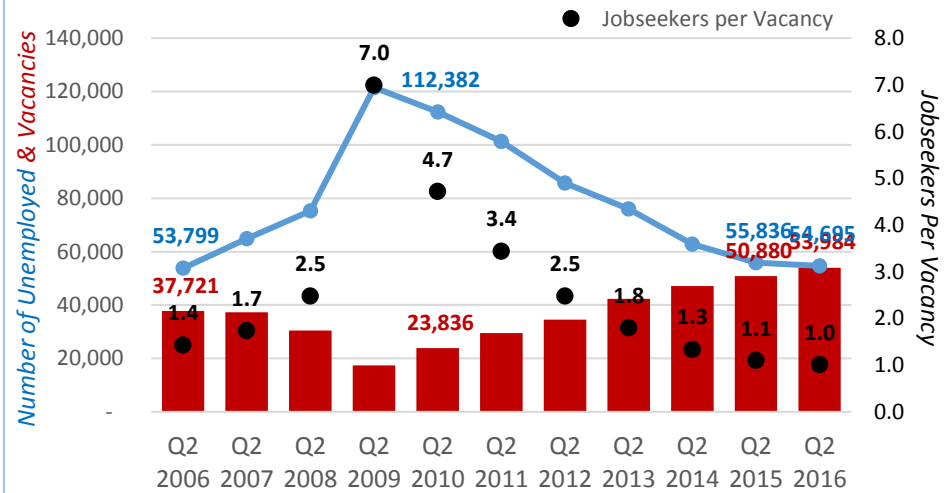

Figure 8. Household Incomes, 2015

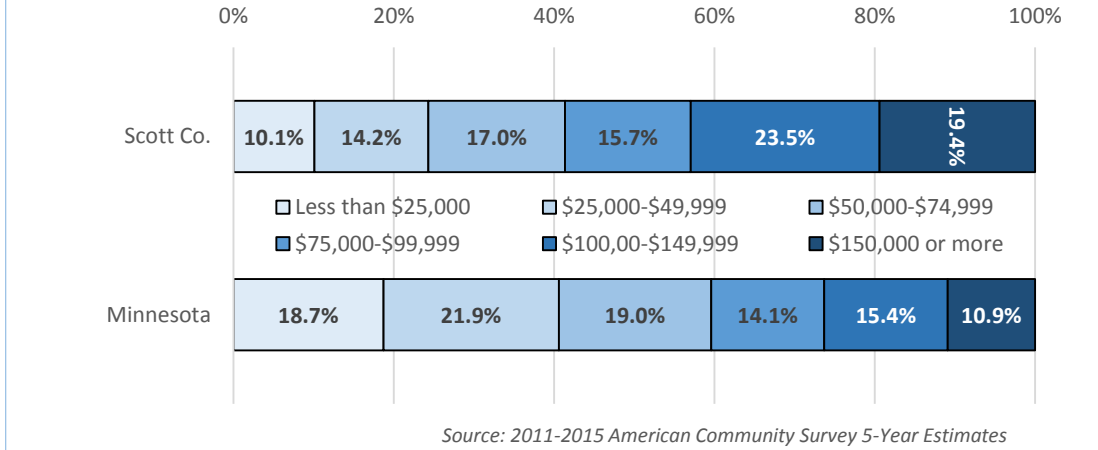
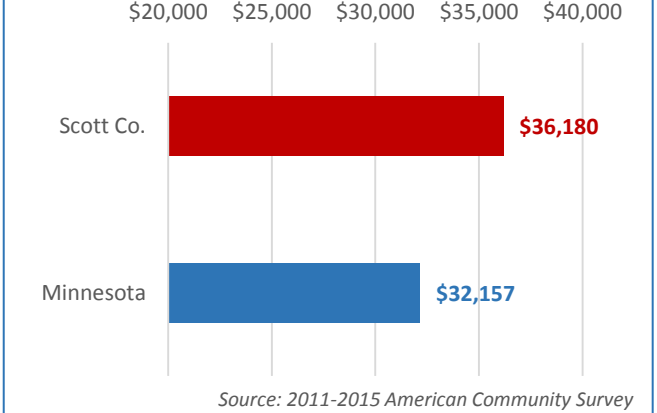

Figure 10. Job Vacancies by Industry, Qtr. 4 2016

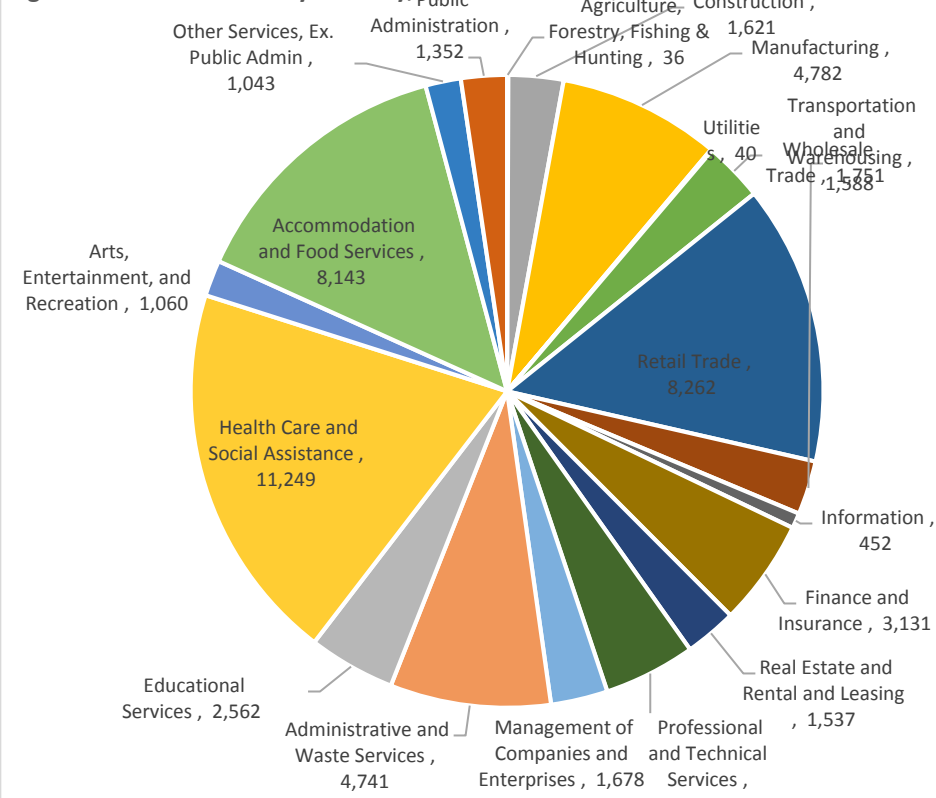
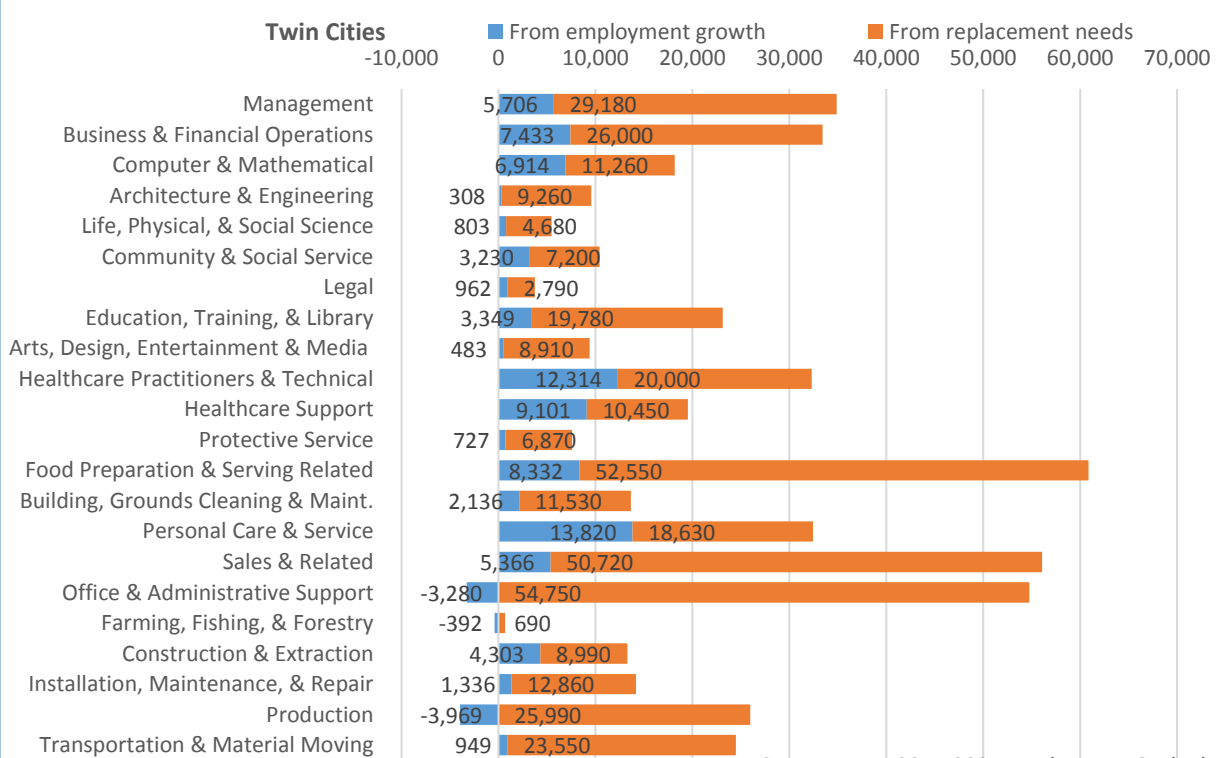

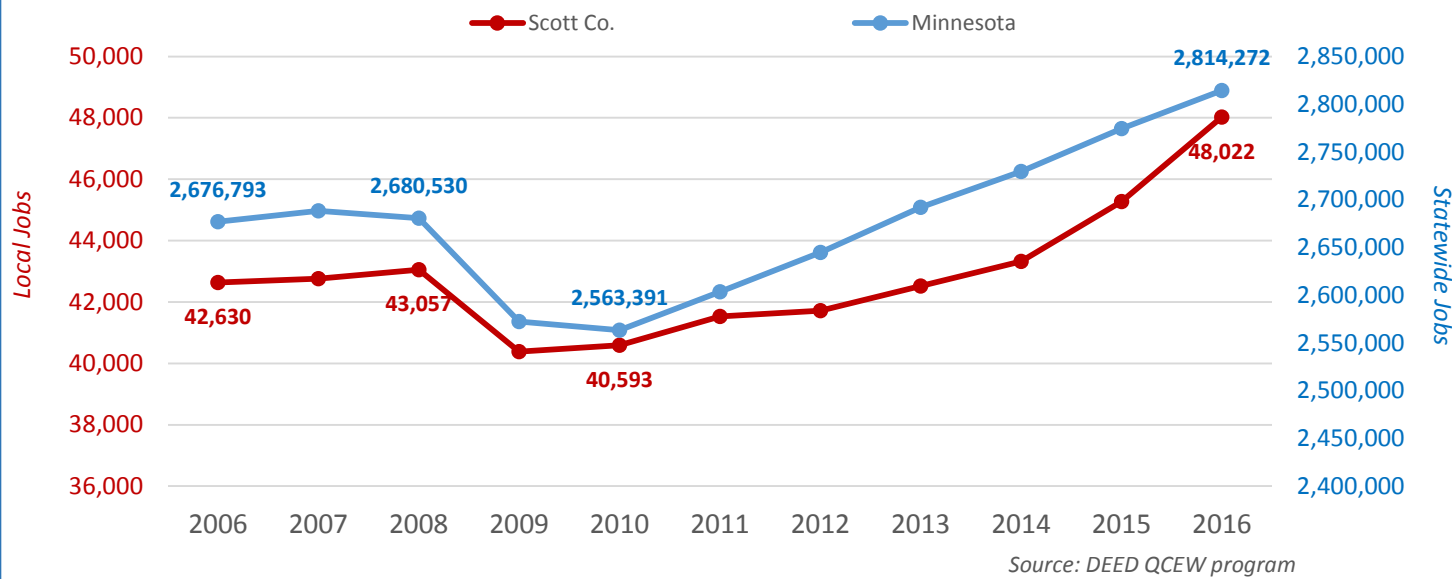
